

Santa Clara Valley Habitat Plan: A Conservation Legacy

This Habitat Conservation Plan/Natural Community
Conservation Plan (HCP/NCCP) will identify and preserve
land that provides important habitat for the Tricolored
Blackbird, Bay Checkerspot Butterfly, Metcalf Canyon
Jewelflower and twenty-seven other endangered and
threatened species. The goal of the HCP/NCCP is to
develop a comprehensive conservation strategy to protect
native wildlife and vegetation in most of the county's
remaining undeveloped areas. Come learn more about
this project and how HCP/NCCPs could work for your
conservation goals.

Background

In many areas of California, development of land for roads, housing and other needs adversely affects wildlife and fish protected by the Federal Endangered Species Act (ESA) and the California Endangered Species Act (CESA). An HCP/NCCP looks at habitat resources on a large area basis and identifies conservation and mitigation measures to protect listed species while allowing for planned development and public agency activities. This joint HCP/NCCP is being prepared by the County of Santa Clara, Cities of San Jose, Gilroy and Morgan Hill, the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority and the Santa Clara Valley Water District.

- Several endangered plant species only occur here in Santa Clara County.
- A regional plan to conserve habitat within the county is underway.
